The Market over the past couple of weeks could be called steady in spots to mostly lower when compared to a month ago. We have seen excellent demand right along, but this has now started to decrease of late, as we would expect with the weather warming up around the country and most buyers having some numbers around them and now they are not really wanting to wean a calf in the middle of summer. With that said, although prices have softened, we are still selling most all weight classes of the better cattle at extremely good levels. We are now seeing all weight classes of calves sell softer when compared to a month ago. The decline in prices would be a wide range with the fleshier softer calves, getting hit the hardest as one would expect. The price decline on the harder thrifter conditioned calves with a good shot program are not near as much and they are selling close to the upper end of the range. The softer cattle or cattle with limited shots selling more in the middle to lower end of the range. Yearling cattle if they have some quality and not too fleshy still showing what I would call steady demand and selling mostly at the upper end of the range.

Butcher cows also still hanging in there selling just maybe five dollars lower on the top end cows with just slightly off demand. Medium and lower yielding cows called fully steady. Expect cows to be tight and this market to hang in there. Although it may fluctuate slightly with the weather, it will not be near as extreme as the calves.

Last Saturday, June 22nd was our annual fall calving female sale and it was another great offering. There were 1002 head of nice young females sold and they were met with extremely good demand averaging \$2915 on the first 900 head sold. The high spots were the better end of the Angus and Red Angus coming three year-old females with the blacks topping at \$3500 on the best ones and \$3700 on the best end of the Reds. It does seem as though the Red Angus females are picking up some added demand as there were 150 head of all solid red coming three-year-olds sorted into six penlots from one ranch source and they averaged \$3536.50 topping all other consignments. We did see about a \$300-\$500 premium paid on the females that were foothill vaccinated or legitimately foothill country raised the ones that also had anaplas vaccine or exposure would be at the upper end of the range.
